Christmas Projects

Belleville Mennonite School elementary students over the past several years have replaced giving Christmas gifts to their teachers with giving to a family or an organization who helps those in need. This year the decision was made to conduct a non-perishable food drive. Over the course of two weeks, students brought in their non-perishable foods and placed them on a table in the hallway. Thursday, December 17, was the deadline for all "gifts" to be in, and the table was filled to overflowing with several bags for a total of 400 items donated. Mrs. Cathy Peachey did the honors of delivering the donated goods to the Lewistown Salvation Army Food Pantry. Shown is a representative from each class from Pre K through 5th grade.



The Belleville Middle School Student Senate collected clothing and toys for three families with a total of eight children in the Mifflin County area who would not have had a Christmas. They worked with Northwestern Human Services and under the direction of Mrs. Chris Baker, middle school senate advisor, over a two-week time period to complete this project. Students were required to bring in a permission slip to be able to participate and were then assigned a gift tag with a specific item for a child. In addition to clothing and toys included in the items donated were five winter coats for the children. This is the third consecutive year the Belleville Mennonite High School student senate, under the direction of advisor, Mr. Randy Yoder, coordinated and collected Toys for Tots. Toys were collected through December 18 and to the Huntingdon County drop-off site, the Huntingdon Community Center where the toys were given out. At the time the toys were delivered, the drop-off site was out of toys, as this year there were 400 families with 1000 children on the list to be helped by Toys for Tots. Classroom Corner

Preschool, Mrs. Zook

Christmas has been on the minds of the pre-kindergarten students. At the beginning of December, each student made a Christmas count-down chain. In the process of making these chains, the children practiced various skills including counting, making patterns, problem solving, sharing, eye-hand coordination, and fine motor skills. Each link had a number written on it. The children removed links for each day as we got closer to Christmas. The remaining links were sent home for the students to continue the count-down at home. Each child was given his/her own copy of *No Room at the Inn: The Nativity Story* by Jean M. Malone as a gift. During our Bible Story time in December, the class followed along in their books while Mrs. Zook read the story to them.

Kindergarten, Mrs. Cathy Peachey

Kindergarten is back at work and play after a relaxing break. We will be reading *Stone Soup* this month. Later we will prepare and cook Stone Soup using a real stone. Kindergarten is beginning to tie their shoes and read books. We learn a lot we need in life in "The Land of Kindergarten" a quote from a kindergartener.

Grade 1, Mrs. Tami Peachey

It is hard to believe that 2010 has arrived! In reading, first grade is beginning a new theme called "Home Sweet Home." In our first story, we encounter a hermit crab looking for a new home. As we learn more about hermit crabs, we will also be getting a new classroom pet, a live hermit crab. This is always a very exciting time for first graders.

Grade 2, Mrs. Beth Peachey

Second Grade just finished memorizing the Ten Commandments. They did an AWESOME job. We will continue learning about Moses and the Tabernacle.

Grade 3, Mr. Byler

We will begin a study of renewable and nonrenewable resources in science. Students will begin to see the importance of nonrenewable, and how they can be used to benefit society; but more importantly, how to protect them. We will also study renewable resources such as water, wind, and solar energy and see how the energy is collected and used from these resources.

Grade 4 & 5, Mrs. Yoder

We will be gearing up for our "Parade of States" after the holidays. This is a really exciting project for both classes, and I'm looking forward to seeing what the students come up with this year. I hope to have a time where we invite family and friends to come see our costumes and posters. I continue to be blessed by each of the students in my classes. Thank-you for your support and encouragement.

Grade 4, Mrs. Young

Fourth grade math continues to work on division and multiplication but also had a chance to measure objects to figure out the perimeter. Fourth grade reading is finishing the unit on American Stories and continues to be great readers!

Middle School, Mrs. Young

Sixth grade English is back as we begin to work on phrases. Be sure to ask your student about the preposition poem they are creating. Middle school spiritual enrichment day was a huge success. Pastor Dave Purdy emphasized our life is a puzzle that is not complete, and God is the only one that sees the completed picture. Great lesson for all of us!

Middle School, Mrs. Baker

We're back at school and hard at work. Some of our topics of study include the skeletal system in sixth grade science and poetry in eighth grade writing. The seventh grade will be doing a book study on "The Giver." Happy New Year!

Learning Support, Mrs. Fleming

As the new year arrives, my students will be starting a number of new projects. Some students will begin a job searching project, while 7th grade English will begin to write their own Mad libs. Happy New Year!

Music, Calculus, Mr. Marasco

Music 6 is has been learning note reading skills through piano playing. This will continue. Music 7 completed a mini unit on bass guitars, and will be returning to music theory in January to discuss intervals and begin to build chords. Music 8 will be continuing to work with more complicated chord theory and piano playing. The whole middle school will be working solfege and part singing for the hymn "Joyful Joyful." The High School choirs are beginning preparations for choir tour music, after spending some time learning the old 606 from the Mennonite Hymnal. In calculus, students are learning implicit differentiation and how to use it to determine exact volumes or areas or other measurements (length or radius...) at an exact moment in time when one component is changing as time goes.

Computer, Mr. Zook

Students in computer classes in grades 8 through 10 will be exploring Flash as they make interactive web-enabled animations. Sixth and seventh grade computer classes will be enhancing their word processing and keyboarding skills. A word of thanks and commendation goes to the students on the Tech Team and the Web Team as they are actively involved in putting their technology knowledge into practice helping to keep the computers in school running, and the school's web site up to date!

History, Mr. Yoder

Grade 6 history is beginning a unit on Byzantium and the origins of Islam. Grade 7 is focusing on the geography and cultures of Central America. World History 9 & 10 have just finished the French Revolution and are ready to begin the Industrial Revolution. American History 11 & 12 are taking an in-depth analysis of the Mexican-American War.

English, Mrs. Quinn

The British lit class just delved into the world of Scrooge and Victorian England. The classes should be able to explain to you what "Bah, humbug" literally means. It may be shocking to you. The World lit class just finished their study of Greek mythology and some important Greek works. Finally, the 8th grade handed in their final copies of their first formal writing assignment to me. I look forward to reading them!

Spanish, Mrs. Souders

This month 1st grade will be learning the Spanish Alphabet, 2nd graders are working on phonics, 3rd grade will be learning numbers, and 4th and 5th will learn to build their family tree in Spanish. The middle school is working on conjugating verbs, and the High School students are learning how to describe themselves in the community.
